## CHRISTMAS TREE FIRE SAFETY



As you deck the halls this holiday season, be fire smart. A small fire that spreads to a Christmas tree can grow large very quickly!

### Picking the tree

- Choose a tree with fresh, green needles that do not fall off when touched.

### Placing the tree

- Before placing the tree in the stand, cut 2" from the base of the trunk.
- Make sure the tree is at least three feet away from any heat source, like fireplaces, radiators, candles, heat vents or lights.
- Make sure the tree is not blocking an exit.
- Add water to the tree stand. Be sure to add water daily.

### Lighting the tree

- Use lights that have the label of an independent testing laboratory. Some lights are only for indoor or outdoor use.
- Replace any string of lights with worn or broken cords or loose bulb connections. Read manufacturer's instructions for number of light strands to connect.
- Never use lit candles to decorate the tree.
- Always turn off Christmas tree lights before leaving home or going to bed.

### After Christmas

- Get rid of the tree after Christmas. Dried-out trees are a fire danger and should not be left in the home or garage, or placed outside against the home. The Public Works Department will pick up discarded live Christmas trees beginning in January.
- Bring outdoor electrical lights inside after the holidays to prevent hazards and make them last longer.

## REMEMBER TO "FREEZE THE GREASE" THIS HOLIDAY SEASON



Over the next few weeks, many households will be cooking more than usual as they prepare to host family members for the holidays. That's why the Department of Public Utilities is asking residents to avoid sending fats, oils, and grease (FOG) down the drain.

Any FOG that enters the plumbing system, whether through your kitchen sink or bathroom toilet, can thicken and block pipes, causing sewage to back up into homes. Proper disposal can save you an inconvenient (and expensive) visit from your plumber.

Here are some simple tips to protect your home from nasty sewer back-ups and save you money this holiday season:

- Store any used oil in a can and freeze it for reuse (make sure to strain out any food particles first). Oil can be kept for up to six months and reused for up to six hours of fry time.
- Pour used oil in a can and place it in the fridge. After the grease hardens, plop the can in the trash.

And remember, turkey grease isn't the only thing you have to be mindful of this holiday season. Many other foods, like salad dressings, butter, ice cream and even baked goods contain large amounts of FOG that can wreak havoc on your sewer system. So be sure to dispose of these foods in the trash as well.

## UPDATE - TOWN OF CAPE CHARLES HISTORIC DISTRICT REGISTER OF HISTORIC PLACES SURVEY MEETING

In 1989 Cape Charles was surveyed by the Virginia Department of Historic Resources (VDHR) and listed as a historic district on the National Register of Historic Places. From that designation, the Town completed a [Preservation Plan in 1996](#), revised the zoning ordinance, established a Historic District Review Board, and adopted historic district design and construction guidelines.

Thanks to grant funding from VDHR, which does not require any Town matching funds, the historic register survey will be updated this fall and winter. The updated survey will review the 1989 document and make appropriate additions and deletions to properties listed in 1989. **A public meeting is scheduled for Tuesday, December 13, 2016, at 6:00 p.m. in the Cape Charles Civic Center to meet the consultant and exchange information about local properties.**

## PLAYGROUND DONORS SIGN

A major renovation of the children's playground in Central Park was completed this year.

This cooperative project between the Town and Citizens for Central Park (CCP) replaced most of the dated play structures with modern equipment at a cost of \$51,000. The Town provided \$20,000 and many hours of staff labor for installation. The balance was contributed by many organizations and individuals. The new playground is enjoyed on a daily basis by both residents and visitors.

CCP recently installed a sign on the playground fence recognizing the major donors: CCP - \$12,800, Northampton County - \$7,500, Cape Charles Rotary Club - \$5,000, Cape Charles School Association - \$4,000.



## CENTRAL PARK COMMEMORATIVE PLAQUE



Did you ever wonder how our beautiful Central Park came to be? Fifteen years ago, a group of citizens had the vision to come together and start planning to convert the former high school athletic field into a community park.

This group was led by part-time resident Mark Usry, and was instrumental in helping the Town secure \$1 million in Federal grants to develop the master plan for the Cape Charles Community Trail and build Phase 1 – Central Park. Today, Central Park is used daily by residents and visitors, hosts a youth soccer league, summer concerts and festivals, and numerous community and private events.

Phase 2 of the Community Trail is now under construction along north Peach Street and Washington Avenue. Citizens for Central Park recently installed a bronze plaque on the brick wall of the west plaza commemorating this achievement.


